Microdermabrasion Edmonton - The condition of Dermatitis Herpetiformis is a chronic skin condition characterized by blisters filled with a watery fluid. It is otherwise called DH or Duhring's Disease. The name implies the meaning in that it is a skin disease which has the certain appearance similar to herpes, however, the condition is not related to or caused by the herpes virus. DH was first described by Dr. Louis Duhring during 1884, thus the name. In 1867, a correlation between gluten intolerance or celiac disease and DH was recognized. In the majority of cases, the age of onset is normally 15 to 40 years, even if, DH could likewise have an effect on children as well as the elderly. Women and men are likewise affected. The prevalence of DH varies from 1 in 400 to 1 in 10,000.

Symptoms

DH has a characteristic rash that contains chronic papulovesicular eruptions and is intensely itchy. Normally, this rash is distributed symmetrically on extensor surfaces like for example the knees, elbows, back of neck, buttocks and the back. The blisters can range from being up to 1 cm across to extremely small. Since this condition is very itch intensive, the desire to scratch could be overwhelming. This can cause the sufferer to truly scratch blisters off before they can be checked by a doctor. Intense itching or intense burning sensation are sometimes felt prior to blisters appearing in a specific area.

If not treated, the severity of DH could significantly vary in time. Usually, the indications originally appear in the early years of adulthood, usually between 20 and 30 years old. The first visible symptoms are the small vesicles or papules that resemble bumps or blisters. The first indications are intensive itching and burning. Normally, the very first blisters appear on the lower end of the spinal column, on the shoulders, along the hairline and at times in the mouth. Rarely, does the rash occur on various mucous membranes other than the lips or the mouth. If gluten ingestion is prevented and the proper medication is given, the indications usually disappear. In several cases, taking oral contraceptives can worsen the symptoms.

The signs of dermatitis herpetiformis are chronic. Generally, the symptoms tend to come and go, often in short periods of time. These signs can be accompanied by abdominal pain and tiredness and some indications of celiac disease.

The rash that is caused by DH forms and disappears in 3 stages. Initially, the person can see a slight discoloration of the skin where the lesions appear. Next, the skin lesions transform into noticeable papules and vesicles which are likely to occur in groups. The healing stage of the lesions is the last stage of development. Usually this set of indications is characterized by a skin color change. This may lead to areas of the skin turning darker or lighter compared to the color of the skin elsewhere on the body. Because of the intense itching, individuals normally scratch which can result in the formation of crusts.
